

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
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






PSR and Schematic Design Timeline

Working with the MSBA: **Understanding the MSBA Grant Program**

Once Schematic Design construction cost estimates are performed, the MSBA's Form 3011 is used to determine the maximum total MSBA grant (considering) cost caps, ineligible items, etc.).

The Maximum Total MSBA Grant is often not fully received by districts for many reasons, including:

- Unspent Funds (you don't spend the money, you don't get reimbursed for it)
- Bids differ from SD estimate
- Change Orders / Contingency Usage (MSBA reviews each CO to determine eligibility) \bullet



Working with the MSBA -Reimbursement

The Town of Sharon's pre-incentive reimbursement rate is 45.32%.

Base Rate = 31% Income Factor = 2.53% **Property Wealth Factor = 11.79%**

Total = 45.32%

Adjusted Total = 47.32% - 49.32%



Targeted Incentive Points: Maintenance = 0 - 2% possible Green Building Program = 2%

Working with the MSBA: Understanding Cost Caps

The MSBA funding assistance program includes various cost caps, including:

- Construction costs exceeding \$333/ eligible SF will not be reimbursed. (Eligible SF determined based off of Initial Space Summary, based off of # students)
- FFE & Technology costs over \$2400 / student will not be reimbursed. •
- Soft costs may not exceed 20% of Construction Costs. lacksquare
- Costs related to site work may not exceed 8% of Construction Costs. \bullet
- Costs related to OPM Basic Services may not exceed 3.5% of Construction Costs. \bullet
- Costs related to Designer Basic Services may not exceed 10% of Construction Costs. \bullet
- Construction Contingency over 1% over Construction Costs will not be reimbursed. \bullet





Working with the MSBA: Understanding Ineligible Costs

- (a) Any costs for an Approved Project in excess of the Total Facilities Grant.
- (b) Financing costs. \bullet
- (c) All costs associated with credit rating services, legal services related to the issuance of any indebtedness, and financial consulting services.
- (d) The cost of legal services.
- (e) The provision of any direct or indirect municipal services. \bullet
- Any funds expended by the Eligible Applicant prior to the execution of a PFA. **(f)** \bullet
- (g) All costs associated with site acquisition. \bullet
- (h) Unsupported or inadequately supported project costs, as determined by the Authority.
- Maintenance or service contracts and warranties. (i) \bullet
- (j) **Duplicate costs or costs unrelated to the project.** lacksquare
- (k) The lease, purchase or rental of storage space, storage facilities, storage trailers, or storage lacksquarecontainers.
- **Costs that are normal operating and maintenance costs of the school district** (|)





Working with the MSBA: Understanding Ineligible Costs

- (n) Penalties, processing fees, catalogue fees, sales tax, memberships, and subscriptions. •
- (o) The costs of local building permits, inspection fees, and any other such fees.
- **Athletic equipment** (p)
- (q) All costs associated with the purchase, lease, improvement, or maintenance of modular units. •
- (r) All costs associated with the swing spaces used for the housing of students.
- (s) All costs associated with the transportation of students. •
- (t) All costs associated with the purchase, lease or use of any vehicle, •
- (u) The costs of any supplies related to the Assisted Facility. •
- (v) All costs associated with the demolition of buildings, unless such costs are deemed by the Authority in writing prior to said • demolition, to be the most cost effective option.
- (w) All costs associated with utilities. •
- (x) All costs associated with cell phone purchase or service. •
- (y) Dedication, ceremonial or celebratory costs. •
- (z) The Authority reserves it right to disallow any costs associated with any change order that deviates from the scope of the project, as determined by the Authority pursuant to the Project Scope and Budget Agreement.
- (aa) Any costs determined by the Authority to be ineligible pursuant to M.G.L. c. 70B, St. 2004, c. 208, 963 CMR 2.00, the MSBA Audit Guidelines, or any other policy, rule, or guideline of the Authority.






CORE ACADEMIC WINGS (2) - TWO FLOORS

PHASING DIAGRAM











AR1 Addition Renovation





Multi-phase renovation project consisting of four phases, each roughly 1 year in duration.

Target substantial completion date is end of summer 2024 with final site work to be completed in Spring of 2025

Addition/ Renovation Option

Multi-phased addition/renovation option. Addition would be constructed and occupied prior to demolition of the old classroom wing.

Renovation of the existing kitchen, arts, music, drama, media, entry and admin would be completed after the new addition is complete.

Target substantial completion date is fall 2023.

Construct new High School facility from Fall 2020 to Spring 2022.

Target substantial completion date is Fall 2022.

Once new facility is built and occupied, the existing school will be demo'd and new athletic fields installed.

Costs should be discussed as projected costs that are highly conceptual in nature based largely on square footage and proposed construction phasing/delivery, but does allow for a comparison/contrast between the options under consideration.

Once the selected design option is further developed through the Schematic Design, a Total Project Budget will be developed which shall be presented to the Building Committee, Sharon Community and the MSBA.
